

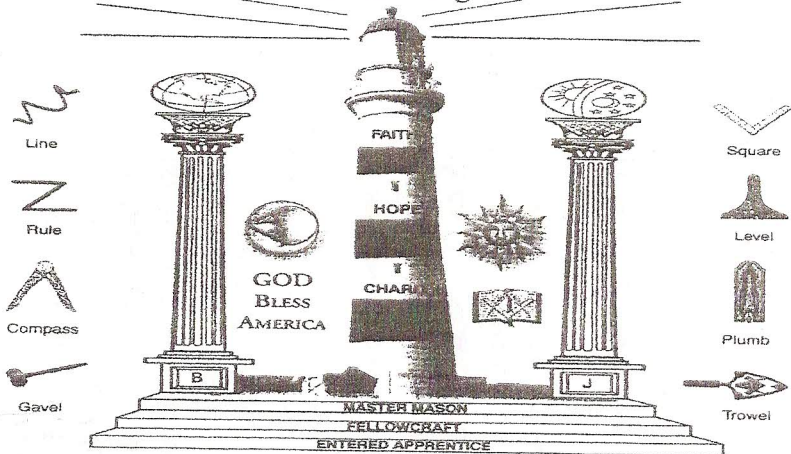

**“Master Mason Rookie Award”
Introduction**

And much to our appreciation, Grand Master JL “George” Aladro and our very own District Deputy Grand Master, John Paniccia, were among those to recognize a most prestigious presentation. All of this attention was the result of Brother Danny Cook’s debut of the “Master Mason Rookie Award” (MMRA) created by him over a year ago. But, more on that in a sec.

The evening, started with a most scrumptious dinner of pork loin roast, carrots, potatoes w/gravy and salad, all prepared by Junior Warden Danny Cook (with *some* assistance). The dinner was graciously served by the Sisters of Canaveral Eastern Star Chapter #297. **Worthy Matron Barbara Hammond, Fern Wolle, Mary Jacobs, Melissa Cooper, Norma Bennett, and Marie Evans** were the Sisters who stepped forward to assist with this most important event. And the delicious desert was courtesy of the Eastern Star Sisters, as well. Thank, you Ladies.

Please understand, the above important tributes had to be expressed first with due mention to those involved so as not to be overshadowed by the impact of the following. And surely it would be, so great a contribution to Masonry this is.

Once in awhile we meet an exceptional Mason with extraordinary forethought and innovative ideas that will enhance our fraternity with a lasting impact. Such is the case with Brother Danny Cook, Junior Warden of Canaveral Lodge #339 in Cocoa Beach, Florida. Brother Danny has diligently focused his Masonic responsibilities on the betterment of the craft since becoming a Master Mason three years ago. In the past year, he has really excelled in a unique way of promoting Masonry by developing the “Master Mason Rookie Award”. Besides his responsibilities of taking new Master Masons “under his wing”, mentoring them by helping with their Masonic education, he has put thought into retaining their interest in the fraternity. Not much more can be expounded upon that will give further understanding to this “Rookie Award” concept other than by simply reading the following:

In order to qualify for the “Rookie Award” the newly raised Master Mason has one year to complete the following requirements:

Part 1:

1. Attend at least 10 Stated Communication Meetings over the course of one year
2. Complete all 3 Master Mason Examinations
3. Complete your Master Mason Catechism
4. Attend at least one (1) Lodge of Instruction meeting
5. Work on at least one (1) Lodge or Charitable Event
6. Serve on one (1) Investigative Committee

Part 2:

7. Attend each of the blue lodge degrees at least once, (EA, FC, MM) and, if necessary, travel to another lodge to complete this requirement.
8. Attend at least one (1) DDGM visit at your home lodge
9. Assist at least once with the preparation of candidates
10. Learn how to properly set up the lodge room for meetings
11. Assist in the kitchen for 1 Sunday breakfast and 1 Friday dinner
12. Attend one (1) Stated Meeting at another lodge

It is hoped that this concept will rapidly spread. Proudly, **Brother Matt Newhouse** was the first to complete these steps to gain the coveted “Master Mason Rookie Award”. It is hoped that document number 0001 will be the first of many, many more to come throughout our Masonic community.

Brother Danny, it is with heart felt appreciation to extend my arm to your shoulder in Brotherly love. Thank you so much for what you have done for the Masonic Fraternity in the few short years that you have been involved. It is with curiosity to see what you will accomplish in the years to come.

District 26
Child Identification Program

It is with the most extreme gratitude that I thank the Brothers who participated in the Masonic Child Identification session for the Boy Scouts at Wickham Park on Saturday, October 20th. There were representatives from Canaveral, Beach, Harbor City, Merritt Island and Indian River Lodges.

Also included in this "massive" effort, were senior Boy Scouts and adult Scout leaders participating in "non-data" collecting rolls. Thanks to all of you many times over for your support.

"Massive" is the only way to describe this event. This was the largest event that the District 26 Child Identification Program has sponsored since its inception over two years ago. In 3.5 hours, 241 children were processed through the program. To date, we are near 1,500 children that have been processed through our system. Next year, that is expected to double.

This accomplishment would not be possible were it not for the support of Districts 15 (Ocala) and 16 (Daytona) to which District 26 is very indebted. Each of those districts brought in three Child ID kits in support of the event for a total of eight kits (to include the two from our District 26). Each kit is only capable of processing 12 children per hour so you can well understand the need for additional support.

District 15 came to the event "fully loaded" with a generator and a 12'x30' canopy which really, really made things easier. (Those are two items on the list for District 26 to obtain- among others.) Bless you Brothers; that generator saved our hind quarters as the sponsor had no idea what our electrical requirements were. Consequently, there was very minimal electrical support- as in a 100', 18 gauge extension cord on a hub with other multiple "100' 18 gauge extension cords". Inevitable result: electrical circuits popping all over the place. So thank you again, District 15, for saving our "bacon".

District 16 was just as prepared with their ID kits, tables, chairs and an additional canopy. This was a combined effort of districts and Brothers, showing the true meaning of Masonic Brotherhood. Thanks, guys- my hand to yours.

The sponsor was so pleased with our "first time" efforts that they have already requested that we come back next year. They had no idea of the extent of our program, nor its intensity. It is assured that word will spread through the Scouting community and our services will be requested elsewhere as well.

For those of you who have cared to read this far, thanks for your interest in the program. Please understand that the Child Identification Program is growing rapidly and it can not continue to do so without your physical support. Please consider offering a little bit of your time.

There is nothing more gratifying than the appreciation of a parent when it comes to the protection of their child.
